### **Nursery and Reception**



## Cubs

This term in Cubs we have been enjoying the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. The children have created houses for the pigs using paint, playdough, sticks and bricks and they had great fun baking Percy Pig Buns. Outside we have learnt how to play 'What's the Time Mr Wolf?' taking turns and following simple instructions. We have also been thinking about the topic 'On the Farm'. The children pushed tractors through paint to make tracks and created farm animals out of paper plates. A favourite song has been 'Old Macdonald had a Farm' with the children making animal noises and doing animal actions.

# Foxes

This term in Foxes we have been concentrating on the topic 'Hot and Cold'. We have enjoyed the stories 'Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What Do You Hear?' and 'Rumble in the Jungle'. We compared the cold environment the animals live in to those found in the hot jungle. In Forest School we searched for ice, bare trees and other signs of winter. We have also made bird feeders and created homes for hibernating animals using leaves, sticks and stones. In Mathematics we counted our collections of winter objects, learning that the last number reached is the total amount. We have also extended our learning of positional language using over, under and through.





## Hedgehog

This half term, Hedgehog Class have had lots to celebrate! We have celebrated the start of a New Year by thinking about the goals we want to set for the year ahead. It has been lovely to welcome some of the Hedgehog Class parents to join us for a Share a Book session, giving the children the chance to share their favourite books. We have also celebrated the Chinese New Year by learning about what different foods symbolise and we had a go at copying some Chinese numbers. Hedgehog Class have also had great fun making tissue paper flowers, cards and baking cookies to give to our guests to show them how much we love them. This was as part of our Valentine's Day celebration.

## Qwl

This half term, we have been learning about the 'Snow Queen'. She sent us a letter and asked for our help because she had lost all of her animal friends. We wrote letters back to her saying say we would love to help, which we posted in our local post box. We found out, through learning the Snow Queen story, that the animals were hibernating because it was too cold. We conducted science experiments to work out how we could melt ice, we told the Snow Queen our findings and she sent us an email back to say she had made a fire which melted the ice, making it warmer so her animal friends came out of hibernation and arrived home. Owl Class have loved this unit of learning and are very happy they could help the Snow Queen!



## Key Stage 1



Dolphin

In Dolphin Class we have thoroughly enjoyed experimenting with different materials to make our own under the sea collage. The children worked as a team with their peers at their tables to produce some magnificent artwork. We have also been learning about the Islamic faith and how Muslims celebrate Eid. We had the chance to hold a Qur'an, a prayer mat and some prayer beads. In Geography we have enjoyed singing our lungs out to the, '7 continents' and '5 Oceans' songs. We can now label the continents and oceans on a world map. In Mathematics we have been practicing our number sentences through telling a story (first, then and now).

## Seahorse

We have learnt so much this half-term about 'Under the Sea'! In Art and Design we spent a whole day making collages using different materials to create under the sea pictures. We took lots of care to add lots of detail and they look fantastic on our corridor display. In Science, we found out about different animal groups. We are now experts on fish and mammals. Exploring new stories in English fired our imaginations. We loved 'The Secret of Black Rock' and had fun acting it out and writing descriptions using amazing adjectives. We are looking forward to our 'Castles' topic next half-term.





## Penguin

Wow! What a busy half term Penguin Class have had. We immersed ourselves in our new topic, with a Traditional Tales Day. We spent the day making puppets, before performing our own version of 'The Three Little Pigs'. In English, we have written stories based on the text, 'Little Red Reading Hood' and written a set of instructions on 'How to make a magical pizza' for the giant in 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. During Design and Technology we made our own bridges, with the purpose of getting The Three Billy Goats Gruff across the water safely, without being eaten by a troll! In Mathematics, we have continued to develop our understanding of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. We have all worked really hard!

## Polar Bear

Polar Bear Class have enjoyed our 'Once Upon a Time' topic. In English, we created alternative versions of 'Little Red Reading Hood'. We also wrote instructions for creating magical pizzas using time conjunctions and published a class recipe book for the giant. In Mathematics, we focused on multiplication and solved a range of problems. We had fun in Geography using map skills and learning how to interpret the symbols in a key. In Design and Technology we helped the Three Billy Goats to reach the lush grass by designing and making bridges out of a variety of materials. We have been very busy!



### **Middle Years**



## Macaw

Macaw Class have had a busy term using their geography skills when learning all about Crete and comparing it to Cambridgeshire. They used their science learning on rocks and soils from last term to help them write fantastic explanation texts about the world that goes on beneath our feet! They also created their own block prints in art, inspired by Greek meanders.

# Toucan

In English, the children have been researching the wondrous world beneath out feet and have written fantastic explanation texts using their knowledge. In Mathematics, they have been gaining confidence in adding and subtracting threedigit numbers using a range of strategies. In Science, the children have been learning about forces and magnets and developing their skills in planning and conducting investigations. Finally, we have been creating printing blocks inspired by Greek meanders in our Art and Design lessons.





# Falcon

Falcon Class have been working hard this half term on our Geography topic 'How We Shape Our Land'. We learnt about the different types of land use and made maps of the local area using a key. In Art and Design we have been painting our own seascapes using watercolour paints. In English, we wrote persuasive letters and a story based on Farther by Grahame Baker-Smith. We used rich vocabulary to explore the emotions in the story and interesting verbs to describe the action. Our photograph shows one of our guided reading sessions when we used a freeze frame drama technique to show what the Vikings looked like when they were running away from the ferocious Green Death dragon in 'How to Train Your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell.

## Kestrel

Kestrel Class have worked very hard this half term! We have practiced persuasive writing based on a local park, which ties in with our Geography topic. In Mathematics, we have continued to develop and consolidate our calculation skills, in particular multiplying and dividing by multiples of 10. We have learnt about the properties of solids, liquids and gases in Science. In Art and Design; we have produced watercolour paintings using a range of techniques for effect. We have also practised gymnastics routines and learnt dribbling, passing and tackling skills in hockey lessons.



### Later Years



Giraffe

In English, we have written our own non-chronological report, learnt how to say which rooms we have in our house (in French) and even created a piece of artwork in the style of Gary Hodges. It has been a busy half term!

## Zebra

This half term, Zebra Class have worked hard to demonstrate their growing mastery of a range of literary devices, in the form of non-chronological factual reports. We were required to analyse examples, conduct research, form detailed plans, and write multiple headed paragraphs. Understanding and using mathematically specific language has been a large focus this term, especially in relation to describing relationships of length, height, and weight in a variety of units. Further to this, we have continued to sharpen our skills in multiple digit multiplication.





## Jaguar

Jaguar Class have certainly hit the ground running at the start of 2024, and have come back to school feeling ready and motivated. They have especially loved our learning on Evolution and Inheritance, particularly enjoying the various practical science experiments that we have done. We have then gone on to apply this learning about adaptation and variation in our English unit on a non-chronological Report. The children worked hard to create their own species of bird and wrote clearly about its habitat, diet and key characteristics. They also enjoyed a hockey tournament against Year 6 children from Queen Edith Primary School.

## Panther

With our topic of South America this half term, we had many opportunities to hone our research skills. We used safe online sites to look for information about regions and ecosystems of South America, as well as understanding human and physical geography within environmental areas. Comparative activities were also incorporated into our learning as we looked at the similarities and differences between the UK and Brazil. We have worked incredibly hard this term, and have truly earned our break.



#### Year 4 Maths Challenge

Many congratulations to our Year 4 teams for proudly representing Queen Emma in an exciting Maths Challenge for Cambridgeshire schools at St Faith's on 25th January. Well done to Jonathan, Sebi, Vaishnavi and Yino who all really enjoyed competing, plus travelling by taxi! They each received a certificate in a recent whole school assembly.
